Recently, Regina Sullivan met in downtown Guilford with Representative Sean Scanlon, CEA Vice President -Jeff Leake, CEA UniServ Rep -Gloria Dimon and AMS teacher - Dennis Cullitan to discuss what's happening in Hartford in terms of the Governor Malloy's proposed budget and its detrimental impact on Guilford Public Schools. FACTS

Teachers are not eligible for Social Security.

Teachers already contribute 57% of the annual cost of providing retirement benefits for today's members.

- Pension
- Healthcare

PENSIONS

- He will reject the cost shift of teacher pensions to cities and towns. The shift would increase property taxes, reduce funds for education, and cost teaching jobs.
- He will protect teacher pensions and keep the existing teacher pension plan.
- He will oppose any increased teacher pension payment.

HEALTHCARE

- He will protect teachers' contracts.
- He will protect teachers' ability to negotiate healthcare benefits.
